## JOIN THE GROUP FLIGHT TO SAN FRANCISCO

Enclosed with this Newsletter is the information on rates and schedules for the group flight to San Francisco. Note that there is a considerable savings if we have a group of 40 going and returning together.

To summarize, plans are to leave Lincoln on Monday morning, June 13, by bus to board the plane in Omaha at 11:15 A.M. This will bring you into San Francisco in time to take that beautiful all-day tour on Tuesday.

The time of return will depend on the will of the majority, either Sunday morning, June 19, or Monday, June 20. The Sunday flight is non-stop. The round trip plane fare with the group is \$170.00 compared to the regular fare of \$256.00, a saving of \$86.00 per person.

The round trip bus fare to Omaha is \$7.50. In San Francisco there will be a special bus to take the group directly to the hotel from the airport, also at a savings as compared to the limousine to the air terminal and then a cab to the hotel.
