Museum Wins Federal Grant

Lincoln, Nebraska—The American Historical Society of Germans from Russia has been awarded a Museum Assessment Program grant by the Institute of Museum and Library Services. Through guided self study and on-site consultation with a museum professional, the grant will enable the American Historical Society of Germans from Russia to evaluate its current practices, establish priorities to achieve professional museum standards, and plan how to best serve the community.

"We congratulate the American Historical Society of Germans from Russia on the receipt of this grant," said Ed Able, president and CEO of

the American Association of Museums (AAM), the organization that develops and manages the grant, "and wish them well as they begin this process of self-review and planning for their future."

The American Historical Society of Germans from Russia is located at 631 "D" Street, Lincoln, Nebraska, and specializes in the history of Germans from Russia. It is open Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. until 3:30 p.m., closed from noon to 1 p.m.; Saturday hours are 9 a.m.-1:30 p.m. Closed Sunday and major holidays.

The Museum Assessment Program is one of several programs offered by the AAM to help museums ac-

tively improve their programs and operations in order to achieve the highest standards of quality and professionalism.

The AAM, based in Washington, D.C., is the national organization representing the concerns of the museum community. The AAM assesses museum programs and accredits museums, provides education and training, operates international museum programs, and advocates for the advancement of museums. Since its founding in 1906, AAM has grown to include more than 15,000 members, including 10,852 museum professionals, 2,988 museums, and 1,215 corporate members. ■

GERMAN PIZZA

- 1/4 cup butter or margarine
- 3 cups frozen shredded hash browns
- 1/8 teaspoon. salt
- pinch pepper
- 4 eggs, lightly beaten
- 1/2 pound fully cooked ham,
julienned
- 1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese

In a medium nonstick skillet over low heat, melt butter. Add potatoes, salt and pepper, cover and cook for 15 minutes, stirring occasionally. Pour eggs over the potatoes; sprinkle with ham. Cover and cook for 10-12 minutes or until the eggs are set. Sprinkle with cheese; cook, uncovered, until melted. Cut into wedges.

Yield: 6 servings.
