- - Fall In The Air

Monday I had the gas company here to light the heater for winter. My North Bottoms house was built in 1895 from what was originally a horse barn. Because of that it sits on three cinder blocks for its foundation. It has just a few feet of space under it so there is no room for a standard furnace.

I imagine many of the small homes in the North Bottoms had these free-standing floor furnaces. They kept the house cozy, but I wish I had a real furnace. Then I could have central air conditioning instead of my window unit.

My house is historically correct, as if it still fit into the original landscape of our German people. They would feel right at home. I love period pieces, and I love flowers and having pretty things around me that feel "homey."

This summer my garden produced some cucumbers and I made a couple of two-gallon crocks of dill pickles. These always remind me of my childhood. My aunt Marie Reich always had a big crock full in her basement. We kids would get one sometimes. We were always looking for the big fat ones. We were not smart enough to take the good medium pickles that tasted sour and dilly – but I remember how yummy they were.

I also loved pickled yellow delicious apples. My cousin Jean Schwartzkopf Hughes made them in the crock. Her brothers were Sam and Ed. My mother Hilda Bridegam canned peaches and pears for the winter.

Fall always reminds me that Thanksgiving, with all of its delicious food, is on the way. My favorite meal has always been turkey and dressing with cranberry sauce. Sometimes we get lucky and go to Cracker Barrel the night they serve it. Runzas and turkey are my favorite eat-out foods.

Well, I'd better stop writing and get something done around the house.


