At that time there were a lot of children and they enjoyed getting up and saying the church piece they were going to perform at the Christmas Eve service. They also played Christmas carols on instruments or sang a Christmas carol, to the delight of their gramparents and the pride of their parents.

Times were different then and children liked going to Sunday school and getting a new Christmas outfit to wear. To be able to memorize your piece and recite it nervously in front of a large audience was both scary and proud at the same time.

But the best time was when Santa came up the back staircase, ringing his bells and shouting "Merry Christmas" to all the kinder and grownups. That simple bag of candy, fruit, and nuts was highly anticipated and enjoyed by all. It was not a bunch of leftover Halloween odd candy. It was a bag of hard candy in peppermint, filled jelly, and my favorite, the round red and white with flag design in the middle. They were licorice tasting.

That bag of candy took a few weeks to eat up. I always took a few pieces in my pocket when we went ice skating. The sack also had a big red delicious apple and a large navel orange. There also were salted in the shell peanuts and sometimes even a few mixed in the shell nuts.

At the same time I was a child Santa was Jake Wyant. He was a jolly old Santa who treated the children kindly. There were no pictures with Santa. He came and gave his greetings and just as quickly slipped away.

It was a magical time for children. Sometimes simple is a heart-felt gesture. The extra bags were taken to our German widows and shutins who enjoyed them as much as the children. We do not remember our elderly neighbors as much today. The simple bag may be their only Christmas gift.

Today things are so much different. seems as though many times one gift is not enough. People expect many, many things and charge cards are over-used. A simple bag is not enough even in hard times.

Oh, to hear Merry Christmas in German again and see our gramparents in their scarves and suits and caps sitting in church to hear their kint say their piece, and see their smiles, and get a koose would be enough for me.

Antiques Roadshow -GR Style




