#### **AHNENSTAMMKARTEI**

The "Leipzig Films"

900 + New Rolls at the Family History Library

Can't find where your elusive German ancestors came from in old Germany? It's worth one more look - and maybe this time you will find some of them.

The Ahnenstammkartei (commonly known as the "Leipzig Films) at the LDS Family History Library European Reference desk in Salt Lake City, UT. Adds 181 pages to the FHL catalog just to list one massive A -Z Surname index found on 621 microfilm rolls.

This is a major collection!

Part I is a massive A-to Z index, 621 microfilm rolls of surnames.

Part II is 250 films rolls containing an index on Ahnenstafein manuscript numbers by film number. These pedigrees cover the former German Empire, not just Leipzig.

You can get started on your "Leipzig Films" research at any LDS Family History Library. Some microfilm rolls may have already be available at local FHLs. If your particular film is not available locally, all you need to do is place an order for your selection.

#### PIED DE GRUE

Do you know where the word pedigree comes from? It is from the old French pied de grue, which means "root of the crane. Genealogists often used a three line chart to illustrate a family tree, and to the onlookers (at that time), its appearance was like that of a bird's footprint.

Thus the word pedigree.

#### Here's a recipe all of you have been waiting for!

#### **HEAVY BORSCH**

1 lb. Soup beef and bone
1 bouillon cube or 1 can of beef broth
2 c. Red cabbage, chopped (opt.)
1 can chopped beets and juice
1 bouillon cube or 1 can of beef broth
2 c. Red cabbage, chopped (opt.)
1/2 c. Lemon juice

1/2 c. Brown sugar
1 Egg, beaten
Salt and Pepper to taste
1/2 pt. Sour cream

Simmer soup bones and beef for at least three hours in 1- quart water, do not let boil dry. Remove bones and fat;add bouillon cube, onion and red cabbage. Cook for thirty minutes. Add beets and juice, lemon juice and brown sugar. Gradually add 1 cup hot soup to egg;stir. Put egg mixture in soup pot;stir. Add salt and pepper. Serve with sour cream.

# Continuing the thumbnail sketch of personnel at: The American Historical Society of Germans from Russia

#### **ILENE BENNETT KIER**

Ilene was born in Nebraska City, Nebraska to Henry and Anna Sadona (Kleineweber) Bennett She lived in Nebraska City for her first two years, then the family moved to Thurman, Iowa, where her father operated a farm. Until 1949. In that year the family moved to Burr, Nebraska, where her father continued to farm.

In 1953, the farm was sold, and the family returned to Nebraska City, with her father renting and owning land in Minersville Bottoms. (Today Minersville is just a dot on the map).

Her mother worked at Penelton Mills Factory, as a trouble shooter, because she could sew or mend anything, and make it look like there had never been any wrong stitching.

Ilene has three brothers and one sister. The oldest brother works for the telephone company. Her second brother drives an 18 wheeler and her third brother is employed by an asbestos company, removing asbestos all over the United States.

Her sister, Linda, was injured in an automobile accident when she was 19 years of age, and has lived with Ilene for the past 30 years.

Ilene graduated from Dunbar High School. After graduation she went to New York City, attending a teletyping school. After graduation, she continued to live in New York for another year, working as a teletypist.

Returning to Nebraska, she entered Nebraska Wesleyan, taking a course in Massage Therapy. In 1965 she married the Chief of Police at Syracuse, Nebraska. From this union one child, Marla was born. The couple were later divorced.

Marla has three children, making Ilene grandmother three times over., which she says keeps her young!

In April 1976, she married Bernard Kiel, of Wymore, Nebraska at the Odd Fellows hall in Lincoln, Nebraska.

Bernard had three children from a previous marriage, a son and two daughters. The son was already married and gone from the home, one daughter died at the age of 15, and the other daughter, Kathleen, was 14 at the time of their marriage.

In April and July, 1976, both Bernard and Ilene adopted each others child. In this way the family became one unit, just as the girls wanted it to be.

Bernard passed away in 1985, after 30 years with the Burlington Railroad.

In all these years, Ilene had operated her own massage business out of their home, but with Bernard gone she lost interest in this work.

She decided to seek other work, working for a telemarketing firm for the next two years.

She then became an employee of the State of Nebraska in the Health Department, where she worked for one year. She also continued to do limited massage work in her home.

In August, 1992, Ilene came to work for the American Historical Society of Germans from Russia at Headquarters.

Her duties here are:

Entering data sent in by members in to the computer, so that eventually all members can research their families by computer rather than the old card file.

At the present time there are over 250,000 names in the computer.

The information contains the husbands name, his spouse, and their children, along with all the birth dates of the family, the marriage dates, and to whom, if applicable and the place and date death along with the place of burial for all.

At the present time the only notes entered are those of the immigration dates.

Some members send in copious notes on their families, which would eliminate much of the room within the computer for the essential information.
