#### Continuing the thumbnail sketches of the personnel at: The American Historical Society of Germans from Russia

#### Jo Ann Kuhr

Jo Ann was born July 4, ("Do I have to give the year?") in Yuma, Colorado to Dr. Clayton J. and Etta (Peat) Bennett. ("I love to have this birth date, because everyone can celebrate my birth day all over the United States").

Jo Ann went to school in Yuma, and when she graduated, she had intentions of becoming a doctor, However she says, "My grades were not good enough to achieve that goal!".

At the University of Colorado, she had a triple major, chemistry, biology and German. After graduation, she went to Erlangen, Germany (which is north of Nuernberg), attended the University there for one year, then worked in the translation department at Siemens Schuckertwerke.

"This is when I really began to learn German! I started out as a typist, then became a translator. When I came back to the United States, I decided to get my Master's Degree in German literature at the University of Colorado", Jo Ann replied.

Her first teaching job was at Lakeland College which is situated between Sheboygan and Plymouth, Wisconsin. She was there for four years. After her first year she realized she needed to go back for additional education.

Jo Ann came to the University of Nebraska - Lincoln in the fall of 1965, and started a program towards a doctorate degree. She finished all the course work and the comprehensive exams by 1968.

It was while she was here she met Art Kuhr, at the Lincoln Community Playhouse where she was a volunteer doing light design.

After finishing her comps she went back to teaching again, at the University of Wisconsin, at LaCrosse, Wisconsin.

As they say "absence makes the heart grow fonder" so when she came back for a visit, Art and she were engaged, then she came back to marry Art in 1970.

Jo Ann remarked," I had hopes of finishing my dissertation, but instead I had two babies. The first slept no more than 6 hours out of 24, if I was lucky! So you can call me a Ph.D. dropout because I never did finish my dissertation!"

She also taught German at the University of Nebraska - Lincoln and at Doane College at Crete, Nebraska.

Jo Ann came to AHSGR in 1979, and says she has really enjoyed her work here. She says she actually has used more German here than when she was teaching. "My German has become more fluent than what it was before".

When she first came to AHSGR they had one file cabinet in which there were 6 drawers of obituaries and 6 drawers of family file cards. That has grown, so that at the present time the Society now has 180 drawers.

Her work here means that she answers a lot of research questions for members who write in. She also helps researchers who visit Headquarters office and guides the other genealogical staff.

She is heavily involved with the Aussiedler Project, trying to help families both in Russia and Germany relocate their relatives in the USA. "I am always very excited when we do find a long missing relative and frustrated when we don't", she says. "Also with this part of the project we maintain correspondence with those who write to us, and then I will ask them to write something about their history to the best of their ability. Through this, the Society is getting bits and pieces about their lives and their villages, which are our ancestral villages".

Jo Ann has done a lot of translating of German to English, and vice versa..

Art and Jo Ann have two daughters. Anna is 22, Gretchen is 20. Anna has a BS in Animal Science from NorthEastern Missouri State University, located at Kirksville, Missouri. At the present time she is at Curtis, Nebraska College of Agriculture Technology preparatory to becoming a Veterinarian Technician. Gretchen has been at the University -Lincoln studying Interior Design. At the present time, however, she is taking a year off from her studies, as a nanny in Fairfield, Connecticut. Interestingly this is the town from where Jo Ann's immigrant ancestors settled in 1644

Art is Assistant Art Director and head of Scenic Design at Nebraska Public Television Station, which is located here in Lincoln.

The family belongs Shepherd of the Hills, an Evangelical Lutheran Church at Hickman. At the present time she is on the church council and is one of the organists.

Jo Ann has always loved music, and has always been involved with music, since she learned to play the piano in the third grade. She has played organ for church since she has been in the 8th grade.

Recently she was invited to Russia by the Landsmannschaft der Volga Deutchen in Saratov. You can read about her trip in another column which was published in the November 1994 newsletter.

This past August Jo Ann was interviewed for a program on public access television. This program is devoted to AHSGR and the history of the Germans From Russia (with a little bit of personal history). A VHS copy of the program is available to be checked out at the AHSGR library.
