Genocide of Germans in Russia

From April 15 to 20 a photo exhibition will be on display at AHSGR Headquarters in Lincoln, Nebraska. The theme of the exhibition will be the sufferings of the Russian Germans in Russia and the former Soviet Union, mainly covering the persecutions beginning in 1917, 1921, and 1933 famines which were created by the government in Russia as part of a plan of genocide against the "kulak" farming population, and the 1941 deportation which was another act of genocide perpetrated against the Russian Germans. On April 21 Mr. Samuel Sinner (member of Lincoln Board of Directors and 2nd vice-president) will deliver a lecture at AHSGR Chapel entitled, "The Genocide of German Ethnic Nationalities in Russia and the Former Soviet Union." The exhibition and lecture are designed to coincide with April 22, the birthdate of Vladimir Lenin, under whose rule the Russian German's greatest sufferings began in 1917.

Do you have photos that you might have received from Russia during this time? If you have, and would like to share them with us, we would post them along with the other items we have in the display. This would give a more intimate side of what this Communistic period meant!

Corey Harbour

Corey is the newest member of the AHSGR staff, coming on board on March 22, 1996. He is replacing Shiela Roche, whose husband has been transferred back to the home insurance office in Iowa.

Corey was born in Auburn, Nebraska to Richard and Kay (Bantz) Harbour on January 5, 1971.

The family at that time was farming near Rulo, Nebraska, but within a short period of years, his father went into partnership with his father on a farm 5 miles south and 1 mile east of Auburn. Corey's father constructed a new home on the property.

Corey lived on this farm until he was in the 7th grade, then he and his mother moved down to Enid, Oklahoma, where he lived for about 1 1/2 years. Returning to Auburn, he attended his high school years at Southeast High School at Stella, Nebraska

While in high school, he was very active in most all the activities, especially those activities centered around music. From the 4th grade on, Corey has been playing a clarinet, in his school bands, and then, became the Drum Major for his high school band, serving in that capacity for the entire four years. According to Corey, he was the first Drum Major the school had for many years.

After graduation, he taught Color Guard for a year, at the high school. He still likes to follow the DCI (Drum Corps International)

He love of theater lead him to participate in school plays throughout his high school years. Some of the plays he was cast in were: "Baby", "The Wizard of Oz, in which he played the part of the scarecrow, and "The Good Life of Charlie Brown". One of the major musicals he would like to see on Broadway is "The Phantom of the Opera". He has seen the musical, but not the one on Broadway.

Looking for a career, he attended Travel Careers Institute at Omaha, where he graduated with honors in 1989. This was a very intensive school, with classes beginning at 1:00 p.m. and lasting until 11:00 p.m. every night.

With the schools record of finding early placements for their graduates, Corey upon graduation, was hired by Hertz Rent a Car in Dallas, Texas., at Love Airport where he worked first as a Customer Service Representative, and then Station Manager, during his 1 1/2 years there. When "Desert Storm" took place, he left and came back to Nebraska.

Just prior to coming with AHSGR, Corey worked for three months with the Holiday Inn at Lawrence, Kansas.

Since coming to AHSGR he has assumed many duties that Shiela had: Accounting, Convention Registration, and Youth Tour Sponsor.
