THEY DESERVE TO BE REMEMBERED

#### THE GENOCIDE OF SOVIET-GERMANS

The consensus of modern scholars is that the Russian-Germans were victims of genocide in the U.S.S.R.:

(1) The United Nations adopted the following definition of genocide on December 8, 1948:

#### ARTICLE II:

In the present Convention, genocide means any of the following acts committed with the intent to destroy in whole or part, a national, ethnically, racial or religious group as such:

- (a) Killing members of the group.
- (b) Causing serious bodily or mental harm to members of the group.
- (c) Deliberately inflicting on the groups condition of life calculated to bring about its physical destruction in whole or in part.
- (d) Imposing measures intended to prevent births within the group.
- (e) Forcibly transferring children of the group to another group.

All of these atrocities were committed against our people. The mass murder was carried out by the following means:

- (1) Unlawful deportation (declared a "crime against humanity" by the Nuremberg War Crimes Tribunal) carried out brutal conditions leading to the deaths of hundreds of thousands at a time.
- (2) Deliberate and murderous mass starvation by means of violent grain requisitions and the denial of relief to the starving.
- (3) Forcibly removing children from the group.
- (4) Preventing births within the group by forceful separation of family members.
- (5) Forced labor in Siberia and Central Asian concentration camps. In Magnitogrosk alone a mass grave of 40,000 Volga Germans has been reported.
- (6) Mass executions of the innocent by shooting, torture and other means.

#### These victims must not be forgotten.

The pain caused by the murder of our relatives is with us today. Vast numbers of our ethical group in North America lost their parents, grandparents, siblings, children, other relatives, and friends to Soviet Genocide. It is time to memorialize them with honor, publicly.

#### **WILMA ORCUTT**

Wilma was born at the Western Nebraska General Hospital in Scottsbluff, Nebraska to George H. and Mary Ellen (Field) Wightman.

All of her childhood was spent in Minatare and Sidney, graduating from Gering High School in 1979.

After graduation, she decided to go on her own, moving to Commerce City, Colorado, where she worked in several office positions during the 1980's.

While there she met Charles David Lee, and married him in 1981. From this marriage, she has one daughter, Melissa Renee' Lee, who is 14 years of age.

After her divorce, Wilma decided to return to Scottsbluff, where she worked as a nurse's assistant at both Scottsbluff Villa in Scottsbluff and the Heritage Health Center in Gering. Part of this time she worked at both places at the same time, for a total of 5 years.

On August 15, 1987 she married Gerald C. Orcutt in Gering.. Gerald was already working for the Burlington Northern Railroad in Alliance at the time of their marriage, but now he has transferred to Lincoln. His position then, as now, was in the mechanical field as pipe fitter at the Burlington Northern Sante Fe West "O" yards.

Coming to Lincoln, Wilma took a job with Milder Manor, a nursing home in Lincoln for a short period of six months. Then because of a back injury, she laid off work for the next two years.

Returning to the work force in 1989, she decided to attend a technical school in Omaha, called Skills Plus, where she took accounting and computer literacy classes.

After graduating in October 1989, she went to work for George Jonaitis, P.C. an accounting firm. where she got her network administrative training. She resigned from this position in order to attend college.

1994 saw a big change in the family when Wilma and Gerald were blessed with twin girls. Stephanie Michelle Rose and Ashlie Nichole Rose Orcutt (Rose was to honor Gerald's mother's name) who were born April 28, 1994.

From August 1993 to September 1995, Wilma attended Southeast Community College receiving an Associate degree in Accounting.

She then went to work as the Administrator of Networking for D.A.Linemann P.C. CPA firm in Lincoln. Her duties were the Administrator of computer network, accounts receivable and payable. She worked here from June 1995 through February 1996.

She then went to work for Dana Cole Accounting firm for six months as a bookkeeper; when she noticed the ad for a data entry position at the American Historical Society of Germans from Russia.

Since coming to AHSGR her duties are: Computer Data Entry and input new genealogy forms to record changes in genealogy records as received from members.
