

# Member in the News...

Persistence results in airline tickets for trauma victims

N ever underestimate the power of persistence.

Persistence paid off for Sid Babcock, RN, BA, nurse manager of Lincoln General Hospital's Pediatrics, Surg-Ease, Ambulatory Surgery, and Preadmission Testing areas. It all began when Melvin and Valerie Muhammed, a couple from Los Angeles, California, were invovled in a motor vehicle accident near Lincoln that totaled their rented van and resulted in traumatic head injuries to their four-year-old daughter, Aiesha.

After Aiesha's two-week stay at Lincoln General's Trauma Center, her father mentioned to Sid his concern that the family did not have enough money to pay for the trip back to Los Angeles. His efforts to find affordable and suitable transportation had not been successful.

"The parents had been wonderful to work with and were very involved in their daughter's care," Sid said. "The cost of the accident, her treatment and the time away from home were financially devastating to them. I just felt someone should lend assistance."

After checking all avenues within the hospital and finding that funds were unavailable for airline tickets, Sid enlisted the help of Sue Russell,

MSW, of the hospital's Social Services department and continued making calls to find assistance. Through their efforts, they learned that airlines provide limited assistance when a medical need exists and were able to obtain three complimentary one-way airline tickets for the family.

Sid and Sue received offers from four people who volunteered to transport the family to Omaha to catch their flight.

Sid received a *Caring Touch* award from Lincoln General for her efforts to help the Muhammed family. This award is given each month to individuals who go above and beyond the call of duty to assist someone and solve a problem.
