Memorandum of Understanding

Lincoln Chapter Use of Headquarters' Building during Non-Business Hours

This Memorandum of Understanding is intended to outline the agreement between the International Headquarters of AHSGR and the Lincoln Chapter.

The Lincoln Chapter has been a major contributor to the success of AHSGR since its formation and has provided considerable amounts of volunteer help and monetary contributions during that time. In recognition of the contribution made by chapter member volunteers, the Board of Directors of AHSGR wishes to encourage greater use of the Headquarters building by chapter members. The official business hours of operation for the

Headquarters will be 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM Monday through Friday, except for holidays and convention closing. The staff will normally work a Monday through Friday schedule. The Lincoln Chapter will have access to the Headquarters building Saturdays and for their chapter meetings at no charge to recognize their volunteer activities. Included is the use of the Boardroom for meetings, the research Library, the break room and other areas agreed through discussions with the Office Manager. The staff offices and other personal work areas would normally be excluded.

The types of uses for the Headquarters building outside the normal hours would typically include chapter meetings, social gatherings, research activities and volunteer projects.

The President of the Lincoln Chapter will have a set of keys to the Headquarters building to open it when necessary outside of normal business hours. The Chapter President may delegate this duty to another trusted chapter member when the occasion warrants. Someone from the Chapter must remain in the facility whenever it is unlocked or outside visitors are in the building, for safety and security reasons. Members using the Headquarters building will be expected to clean up the areas after use and in general adhere to Headquarters operating policies that apply.

Members from other chapters travel great distances to use the Headquarters facilities. These other members may use the facilities, with prior arrangements, during the non-business time Lincoln Chapter Members are in the building. There is no obligation on the part of the Lincoln Chapter to keep the facility open when there are no Chapter Members available and willing to do so. Visiting members are encouraged to call ahead to see if a Lincoln Chapter Member is available to have the facility open for their use.

Either party may rescind this agreement at any time upon written notice.
