am happy to report that, since we had the story about the Quilters in the newsletter, Judy Runion reports that their ranks have grown. These ladies are:



MUSICAL MEMORIES

ave you ever heard any of our people say they didn't like music? None that I can recall. Often, just talking about the singing in our churches here in Lincoln brings fond memories. The singing in the Sunday schools, prayer meetings, and during regular Sunday services was harmonious, and certainly done with much enthusiasm.

Our people didn't need psychologists, psychiatrists, or counselors: they talked to their friends and family members, and they sang their sorrows away in their churches, prayer groups, and at home. The psalmist says to "make a joyful noise unto the Lord," and didn't we when the whole congregation sang "O du frahliche" on Christmas Eve!

Remember in warmer weather when the windows were open, because none of our churches were air conditioned, and you could hear them singing nearly a block away. "Jesu geh voran" took many of our people from cradle to their grave.

Each church was blessed with some talented people who willingly gave their time and talents to play the piano, organ, or to direct the choir. Some are still active in their church's music program. Some who come to mind are:

Elsa Weber Amen, who began playing the piano at Ebenezer when she was just a teenager. She even played for "Gross Versamlung."

<u>Frieda Brehm</u> Wall who still plays piano at Immanuel Church.

St. John's on 10th & Charleston had three Helens: <u>Helen Snyder Raymer</u>, <u>Helen Reifschneider</u>, and <u>Helen Hempel</u> Smith.

At Salem (now Faith UCC) several ministers' wives directed the choir and played the organ, Mrs. Roemmich and Mrs. Kissler, to name two, and later Beverly Maser Kissler served Faith church for a number of years. At First German some of their ministers wives helped with the music, and Rev. Rieger built hackbretts (hammered dulcimers). Donald Ernst and his father were leaders in their music programs, and Henry Heckman still enjoys singing.

Helen Moessner, a lovely lady, played the organ for many years at Friedens Lutheran. One of our life members, Lydia Spomer, was often a soloist at Immanuel Lutheran. Mary Joyce Deer worked with their youth choir and Kathy Schreiber Svoboda now directs their madchen chor. At Zion church, August Heinz, his wife, and later his son, Reuben, played the organ and directed the choir. Verna Loos Damm began playing for the German service when she was still in high school. When Rueben Heinz died suddenly, Verna became the organist and choir director and served Zion for many years.

Whether playing for a sing-a-long at Lancaster Manor or playing at church, Katherine continues to inspire others with her beautiful, upbeat playing. She first played a toy piano. Later she took piano lessons at Park school. They used a cardboard keyboard and took turns playing the lesson on the one, real piano they had. In 1984, Katherine organized the German Singers, and many from our German churches enjoyed the old songs. The group grew to 55 members and for thirteen years brought joy to people in nursing homes, senior centers, and special church and club events. Their number is dwindling, but 26 of them recently got together for a good hour of singing their favorite songs.

I know I've omitted a number of people who should have been mention ed in this reminiscence. It is not intentional. I just don't know the many others, but I hope this will start you on your own journey down memory lane.
