As usual, there was a shortage of volunteers but those who did help did it willingly and happily.



don't know how many times I have heard, "We need to get younger members involved." I know a lot of members whose parents were very involved with AHSGR but their children don't seem to be.


Diane White seems to be the exception. Her three children — Ray, Nancy and Will — can be seen helping at dinners and chapter
