The International Board meetings were held in Lincoln on March 22-24. It was noted that our membership renewals are down a bit which affect the budget; however, an effort is being made to contact those who have not renewed.

New chairs have been purchased for the Board Room at the Heritage Center. Society Board and Trustee members were encouraged to purchase a chair for \$50 and we have 34

paid for or pledged.

A new structure for the yearly dues will be effective in 2013. There will be a Supporting Membership for \$35 with no Journals or Newsletters but all other communications. There will also be a Standard membership for \$50 which will receive all communications including Journals and Newsletters. The Premium membership, for \$100 will include all mailings, Including CLUES and Membership Plus. Also, Life Members, effective in 2013, will receive Membership Plus at no additional cost.

The 2012 Convention is being held in Portland, OR on June 12-17 and in 2013 it will be held in Ft. Collins, CO on July 7-14. Also 2013 will be the 250th Anniversary of the Manifesto.

Through an event at the University of Nebraska, several projects will be done at Headquarters on April 21. Two of the outbuildings will be painted on the outside, all buildings cleaned inside and the bookstore in the Headquarters building will have all the shelves cleaned. ■

Membership

about it. So as we got into the latter part of middle-age we had more time and we began to join AHSGR. Not as many as the first generation but enough to keep membership fairly consistent. The third generation didn't have the roots we did. Then many of the fourth generation do their research online. They join AHSGR for a year or two until they have all the information AHSGR has that will help them and then they let their membership lapse and they go to other websites to continue research.

We've lost most of the first generation. Almost all of the work crew that helped build our campus is gone. Those that are still with us have a spirit that burns brightly but the body just can't do it. ■

I am including a list of words that may help genealogists who are beginners. It also shows how difficult it can be.

Vocabulary Study

For the amateur genealogist, certain key German words are necessary. Below are key English words and the German equivalent or words with similar meanings.

Birth: Geburten, Geboren,
Geburtsregister, Geborene
Burial: Beerdigung, begraben,
bestattet, beerdigt
Child: Kind, Kinder
Confirmations: Konfirmationen,
Firmungen
Death: Tote, Tod, sterben, starb, verstorben, gestorben
Father: Vater
Husband: Mann, Ehemann, Gatte
Index: Verzeichnis, Register

Marriage bans: Proklamationen,
Aufgebote
Mother: Mutte

Molly loved to go to AHSGR functions and would sometimes dress the way they did in the "Old Country." The shawl Molly wore came from Russia [the old country] with her family. Her father raised camels and the shawl was made from camel hair. ■

The Lincoln newspaper has a reporter named Cindy Lange-Kubick. She reports on things that I would call human interest. The stories are generally very good and usually very interesting. The story in a recent issue was about "muching."

Cindy got a call from Victoria Miller, a descendant from Germans from Russia, who said they used the word when she was growing up and thought it was "muchen" a verb meaning "to much" or "to be muching." She still uses it as a verb. She also thought it meant "I'm experimenting. You're in the kitchen, you don't have what the recipe calls for so you improvise and put something in that you do have."

There are other examples given but I think you probably get the point. This was the way they cooked and that is why many things never tasted the same twice.

Roger Trautwein's wife, Karen, who is of GR heritage, is one of the best "muchers" I know as is our daughter, Pam.

Newsletters from Other Chapters

For years the Lincoln Chapter has sent our newsletters to other chapters and in turn we have received theirs. So when I see a particularly good article I like to include it in our newsletter, always giving them credit, of course.

One newsletter that I have used from time to time is from Calgary, Alberta, Canada. Their last issue (March) had a cooking demo of Platchinda. It's a pie-like dish that sounded very good. There was also a recipe for Golden Pumpkin Soup that sounded good, so I'm including both of them.

Platchinda

Presented in a cooking demo at Calgary Chapter of AHSGR on Saturday, January 21, 2012 by Emma Hay

Dough:

3 cups flour
3 tbsp. sugar
½ cup lard
1 cup milk
3 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. salt
1 egg
1 egg (for wash)

Filling:

1 qt. cooked pumpkin
¾ cup sugar
¼ tsp. cloves
1 tsp. cinnamon
½ tsp. allspice
½ tsp. salt
½ tsp. nutmeg
just a little pepper

Mix dry ingredients and add lard. Mix as for pie crust. Beat egg with a fork and add milk to the egg, then add to dry ingredients. Divide into eight parts, roll out as pie crust. Put about ½ cup filling on one side of each circle. Fold over filling, pinch edge together. Cut a few slits in dough. (Do not worry if they do not look perfect). Brush with an egg wash. Bake at 375 degrees F. for 30 minutes. (Check carefully—may need a little longer to become brown and well done.)

Note from Emma Hay—"The recipe I am using is from our "Mammel" family cookbook we made in 1997, and was submitted by the Hilz family. I found some recipes that use yeast dough, but my mother did not. Plachinda can be sweet or savoury, depending on your personal preference. I prefer the sweet because that was the way my mother made them, the other way is with a lot of pepper and onions."

Golden Pumpkin Soup

(about 8 cups)

3 green (or ½ cup) regular onions, chopped	1 tsp. ground ginger
2 Tbsp. butter	½ tsp. salt
1 cup grated carrot	Freshly ground pepper
1 can creamed corn	3 cups water, stock or apple juice
2 cups pumpkin puree (homemade is best)	1 can coconut milk
1 tsp. ground cumin	

Melt the butter in a saucepan and brown the onions. Add the remaining ingredients, except the coconut milk, and simmer for 20 to 30 minutes. Add the coconut milk, heat through and serve. Use an immersion blender if you want a smoother soup. Note: For variety, substitute cream for the coconut milk, or add a can of beans or some diced ham. This freezes very well. ■

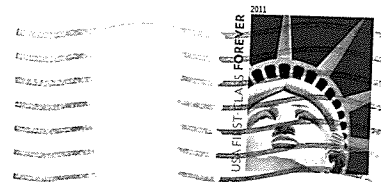

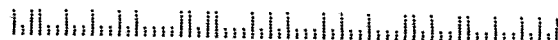
