

### Recipes!

he following recipes were in the March issue of the Calgary Chapter's newsletter. They are quite similar to the one Becky Schenaman's sent us. Hope you enjoy them. Thanks to the Calgary Chapter for permission to print these recipes.

### **Soup Dumplings**

1 cup water

1 egg

1 tbsp oil

Flour to form a sticky dough

Beat water, oil and egg together well. Start adding flour and mixing with a fork, beating to work in a good stretch to the dough. Continue adding flour until the dough is very pully and stiff (don't you just love the description, but it's how my mother taught me.)

Bring a pot of salted water to a boil, dip a teaspoon into the boiling water and then cut off a small piece of dough and drop into the water. I do about 1/3 to 1/2 at a time depending on how large of dumpling I make. The smaller is really better. Let rise to top and cook for 4-5 minutes. Take out and put on a wire rack over a cookie sheet to drain.

You can use right away—if you have soup ready just drop them into the boiling soup, put a lid on and let sit for a couple of minutes to heat through—they puff up nicely. Freeze until solid on a cookie sheet, pack into bags and when you next do soup, just throw a few frozen dumpling into it.

### Nepfla

Hermaine Bauer's Recipe by Adena Bauer

2 cups flour
½ tsp salt (suit yourself)
¾ tsp baking powder
cold water

Cut potatoes and boil in lots of water with salt for 5-10 minutes. Make your nepfla dough stiff, and cut small pieces into the potatoes and boil 'til they float. Put oil/lard in frying pan and fry 'til crusty. Either cook the onions first and add the nepfla or add the onions to them while cooking. You don't have to use onions. Add small bacon pieces, serve with sauer-kraut, or eat just as they are.

This recipe can be made ahead, the nepfla dried and then frozen loose on a cookie sheet, bagged, put in the freezer and taken out when the urge for homemade goodness hits.

### **Green Onion Soup**

oday I checked my garden and to my delight the wild green onion tops were up and ready to use. Growing up I loved having my grandmother Dello's green onion soup. This was her recipe she made for soup in the beet fields. In the beet fields there was no refrigeration so you used the basics in foods that could be found growing wild on the farmer's land, such as wild onions. Grandma would gather fresh onions and wash them and chop them into small pieces, she would only use the tops so that the wild onion could continue to put up new green tops which could keep the family in onions for some time. She also used the potatoes they had planted when they first arrived at the beet field. Most farmers had chickens on the farm so fresh eggs where available. Our grandparents brought flour, salt, sugar, sauerkraut, smoked meats, or meats preserved in crocks, with them. They also brought potatoes, grease, margarine, dried fruits, and staples they might need for the season. This soup is really good and it is very easy to make. My grandma just used water and a stick of margarine as her stock base, but I use chicken broth for my version.

Beet Field Green Onion Soup

(Katherine Dello's recipe from Laub Russia) Makes 3 servings.

2 cans chicken broth

1 can water

2 large potatoes, cubed in small pieces

A large handful of fresh green onion tops (if you are using store bought onions, use 2 bunches) chop up to the onion bulb.)

Salt and pepper to taste

Cook until potatoes are done. This will be at a soft boil stage. Take two raw eggs; break into the soup broth, one egg at a time. Keep stirring with a fork to make eggs turn stringy. In a bowl, take one raw egg and some water and salt, stir until mixed, then add enough flour to egg mixture to form a dough ball. Take small pieces of dough and drop into boiling soup. Cook until dough forms into small gleese balls. Serve in soup bowls. This will make three regular-size servings.

If any of your relatives have ever made this soup, let me know. Everyone I have ever asked had never heard of it. This is a favorite meatless soup for the Dello's and Bridegam families. It is my favorite also. Enjoy!

Sign up your child, grandchild, nephew or niece to participate in this fun one-day event. The Hershey program is free and in over 35 years, never changed a dime for children to compete. Children run, jump, and throw to see how they can do in an atmosphere full of cheering, adoring fans. Children do not have to be a resident of Lincoln to participate as athletes from all around the area compete as well. Pre-registration is required and must be submitted by Wednesday, May 15. However, 20 years later in 2010, that first generation of American-born was dying out in large numbers. So, another membership drop. Unfortunately analyzing the situation doesn't provide a solution. My children are polite and respectful, but not interested.

Is it only the retired and elderly who seem to care?
