Following our recent community service work helping to feed Lincoln's hungry children through the Food Bank's backpack program, we have been asked to make a few more community service appearances.

First on the calendar is the Lincoln Children's Museum "World Wonders" Celebration! We have been invited to participate in this



program on Saturday, March 18, at the Lincoln Children's Museum. We will be at the museum from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. meeting and greeting many children and families and explaining to them what German-Russian culture is all about.

Second on the calendar, the Lincoln Chapter has been invited to celebrate the state's birthday by participating in the **Nebraska 150**



Celebration INSIDE the state capitol on Saturday, April 8. We will be representing immigrants to the state of Nebraska. The event runs from 1:30-4:00 p.m. Other partners include Nebraska Capitol Commission, Cornhusker Council of Boy Scouts of America, University of Nebraska-Lincoln, University of Nebraska State Museum, Nebraska Commission on Indian Affairs, Nebraska State Historical Society, Mayhew Cabin and Historic Village, The Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, Lincoln Literacy Council, and Office of Governor Pete Rickets, so we are in good company.

At both events we will have our traditional "quilting station" where we have quilts on display and children can design their own patterns with sticky foam shapes that they can proudly take home. We also have adapted the popular GR outdoor game of *bunnock* to the indoors and will be teaching families the game and help them knock down the pins.

Also scheduled in May will be our appearance at the Norwood Park Block Party on the evening of Friday, May 13, where will be teaching bunnock. More information will be forthcoming about that appearance.

Our public appearances are a lot of fun and the board always welcomes other members looking for a good time interacting with the public to join in. Experienced event staff will be there to help so you don't have to "figure it out on your own." You don't have to be at an event the entire time. North Bottoms Memories of Grampa and Gramma

I just came home from the grocery store and while I was shopping I was surprised to see they had packets of flower and garden seeds on the racks already. Today is the first of February. Do you remember how fun it was to go through the spring garden catalogs?

My grampa Bridegram always had a large selection of them. I could sit for hours and browse through them. His little house on 3rd and B streets had a small orchard in the yard. He grew plums, cherries, apples, and pears.

The fruit was for eating and making small batches of homemade wine in his red wing crock. He made the best wine. I liked his plum wine as it was very sweet. On holidays even us children got a thimble full of wine with our meal.

Grampa Bridegam was a short person like myself. He was heavy-set and always wore dress pants and starched dress shirts at home. He worked for the Burlington Railroad cleaning switches and helping lay track. He worked hard. He never drove or owned a car. He and gramma always walked or took a cab.

When you came to visit, grampa would greet you at the door with his same greeting, "Hi ya, hi ya." My name is Becky, but for my whole live he called me "Betty." I always got a kick out of that.

Grampa went to Zion Church and taught Sunday school there. That is where my father Henry Junior and my Aunt Minnie were confirmed.

As a child I would spend a week or two at their house in the south bottoms. By this time they had moved across the street from "F Street" park at 1011 South 6th. Their homes were always pretty. My gramma liked nice furniture and when she got new pieces we got her old furniture. I liked that also. One piece she gave us was a couch that was upholstered with an off-white satin covering of pink clusters of roses. It was a beautiful piece.

I think I am like my gramma as I like to decorate and am a fussy cleaner. When gramma washed on Saturdays it made the whole basement smell like Clorox. She made wonderful rye bread and coffee cakes. So those packets of garden seeds brought these wonderful German memories back to me.

WSI Hall History

Here is some history about our beloved Hall. Many of you who grew up in the North and South Bottoms have fond memories of the summer picnics, Christmas programs, broda dinners, and soup suppers.

The Welfare Society, Inc. (WSI) was started as a social club known as the Northside Christian Association in 1906. It was located on the corner of 9th and New Hampshire Streets. The club later changed its' name to The Neighborhood House. In 1917, the name was once again changed to the Welfare Society.

The Board of Education needed the land at 9th and New Hampshire streets for a playground for Hayward school. As a result, the land at 1430 North 10th Street was purchased on June 16, 1926. The present structure was opened on Thanksgiving Day, 1927.

Over the years membership and activities have slowly declined. There are few GRs that have an interest in participating and joining the WSI Hall. It's up to you – if you want to keep traditions alive, join and support the WSI Hall.

Winter Meeting Recap

The annual Winter General Meeting was held January 8th at the Immanuel Church Fellowship Hall at 10th & Charleston Streets. A good turnout showed up as a potluck lunch was served and election of officers was conducted. Jane Harrison, Austen Jacox, and Kay Wood were added to the board. However, the highlight of the afternoon was our fourth presenter in the Lincoln Chapter's "Speaker Series," an ongoing informative and educational lecture series.

The man of the hour was Lincoln historian and author Edward F. Zimmer. Doctor Zimmer presented an interesting slideshow presentation about how he takes historical photos and places names and locations to them. Through a tiny bit of information left behind from the photo he can trace who might be in that photo and almost precisely pinpoint where and when the photo was taken. He then took questions from the group.


One of his prime examples was a photo taken of one of our Germans from Russia taken from over 100 years ago in Lincoln. It had been used in an article from the September 2014 Lincoln Chapter Newsletter about Cooper (or "F" Street) Park.

Through Dr. Zimmer's research it turns out what was originally thought to be a photo at the park was taken somewhere else – not far away

though. It was actually taken a block away, on the playground of Park School, before it burned down and was replaced by most of the current building.

Dr. Zimmer showed how he came to that conclusion and gave us tips on how we can investigate photos as well. He has been granted permission to use the photo and it is now part of his slideshow program he presents to other groups as well – another North and South Bottoms highlight.

Thank you to Dr. Zimmer. Look for additional interesting speakers to be presented in the future from your Lincoln Chapter.
