North Bottoms Memories

- - Winter Wonderland

As a child did you ever have a certain thing you wanted for Christmas but never received? My



wish was a Terri Lee doll. Every year I would ask for one on my birthday and for Christmas – and every year she never came. I would get a doll sometimes, but it was a "Ma Ma" doll that would cry when you tipped her over. You know the kind with the composition head and arms and legs. They were pretty but they were not Terri with her hand painted face and all those different clothes she wore. She was my dream doll. After

a few years I gave up the dream.

One year when I was twelve or thirteen, us four kids each received a pair of ice skates. The girls received white ones. I had weak ankles and never was much of a skater. However, we would go to 33rd and "O" Street by the big Mug Root Beer stand and skate at the city pond there. Someone would have a wood fire burning were you could warm up. If we didn't go to 33rd & "O" Street we went to Peter Pan Park and skated on the frozen tennis courts. Occasionally we went to Oak Lake. That was fun because they had a shelter house with a big fire place to warm up by. As you can tell, it always seemed very cold outside.

When we were teenagers, a group of three South Bottoms boys would come over and take Donna, Linda, and myself ice skating out at Sawyer Snell Park. They were nice, funny boys. I met them when I spent the night at my grandparent Bridegam's. They would sit on grampa's porch and we would talk until it was dark. Then grampa would shut the porch light off to signal it was time for them to go home.

In the fall of that year the boys came over to my house since one of them had a car. They had

brought a big bunch of rhubarb stalks. We had a two-story house and they pulled the car right under our parents' bedroom window. Donna and I slept in the next room. All of a sudden, we heard these thumps hitting the side of the house and guys hollering, "Do you think the rain will hurt the rhubarb?"

We never told dad who those boys with the rhubarb were, but they finally got up the nerve to come over and ask us girls to go ice skating with them. Since they were South Bottoms German boys, it was fine with our father as he was a South Bottoms German-Russian.

That was the start of my high school years and meeting German boys. As a teenager I put away the dream of my own Terri Lee, and wanted clothes instead for Christmas and my first bottle of perfume.


